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

Dear Parents / Carers of Exwick Heights Year 6 pupils,

In **English**, we will be focusing on the speaking and listening element of the curriculum with our production rehearsals! We will be securing pupils' confidence in oracy before secondary school. Children will also be writing their own Dragonology information texts, creating their own monsters!



Supporting learning at home: Please ensure that your child practises their weekly spellings and encourage regular handwriting practice at home!



Our new class book is 'The Boy Who Made Everyone Laugh!' by Helen Rutter. This book documents Billy's transition to secondary school and follows his story as he dreams of being a stand-up comedian, despite his stammer.

Supporting learning at home: As always, do encourage your child to read a range of books, both fiction and non-fiction. Year 6 children should read for a minimum of 30 minutes a day and, for each book your child reads, they can complete an Accelerated Reader quiz to earn points - eventually becoming a Word Millionaire and more! Please model reading for pleasure by ensuring that your child sees you reading too!

In **Mathematics**, we will be building links between Maths and the wider world. We will be carrying out a variety of maths projects for example, in one, children will learn about salary, tax and the finance involved in running a small business! Some budding entrepreneurs perhaps! We will continue to review the maths learnt over the year.



Supporting learning at home: Please ensure that children are given opportunities to consolidate their understanding of real world maths (money, time) in context - bus timetables and budgeting are good examples.



We will continue to look at the **Circulatory System** in **Science**. Pupils will be able to describe the main functions of the heart as well as the different components of blood. We'll also study the impact of drugs, exercise and diet on our heart's health. We will also be welcoming in a friend of the school, Sam Gamper-Clarke, to teach pupils about how to look after the heart and first aid! **Supporting learning home:** You can help your child by encouraging good heart health through regular physical fitness and eating well!

In **Geography**, we will be exploring Globalisation, looking at the big global companies around the world including clothing brands such as Nike and Adidas as well as food trades such as McDonalds. We will look at fast fashion and the dangers involved as well as how companies use technology to ensure fast expansion.



Supporting learning at home: Take a trip to the high street? Can you spot independent shops and chains? What's the balance?


In **DT**, we will be looking at **Structure and Sewing**! Pupils use their DT skills over the year to create production props and costumes, refining their blanket stitching to create outfits and using their knowledge of 3D form to create props.






In our **Physical Education** sessions, we will be looking at **Tennis** and **Rounders!** In Tennis, we will look at our serves, forehands and backhands whilst honing the accuracy of our hits. We will play competitive games - both doubles and singles - focusing sportsmanship. In Rounders, we aim to develop our skills of fielding looking at our underarm and overarm throws, working on our team work to catch out the opposition. **Supporting learning at home:** Encouraging physical fitness. This can take the form of encouraging your child to join an active club or simply just going for family walks!

This term's **PSHE** is all about **Changing Me**. This topic will involve understanding how the body changes during puberty and how we can respond to these changes. Please refer to the letter sent out last half term about the focus for this half term.








In **RE**, we will look at the big question, 'What do religious and non-religious world views teach about caring for our world?' This unit is all about considering different religious beliefs. We will explore what people believe about our world and why they believe it. We will discuss what must happen for our people and our planet to survive and actions we can take to re-balance any prior and current exploitation of our planet.

In our **Music** lessons, we will work towards our production: **Aladdin!** We have hosted auditions; the standard of the performances was amazing. Now, we will continue to learn songs and begin to learn lines. We will begin to stage the production and already feel so proud of what the children have achieved - the performances will soon come around!





In **French**, we use the scheme Salut to explore the unit **'Jobs'**. Children will build a conversational structure which they can use to say what they would like to do as a job. Pupils will also learn how to say a selection of job titles and workplaces in French.

Supporting learning at home: There are lots of apps to help with language learning - try Duolingo with your child.
