Dear Parents/Carers of Exwick Heights Primary School Nursery pupils,



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This half term, we will be exploring the theme of Relationships. Through a range of adult-led and child-initiated activities, we will talk about family and friends, including things we like about our friends. We will explore how to make friends, when feeling lonely and how to work together. We will also learn strategies to help manage our feelings.

Supporting learning at home: Please encourage your child to share at home e.g. sharing toys/objects or treats between siblings. Help your child to identify activities that enable them to calm/manage their feelings; for example, choosing a piece of music to listen to or quieter activities, such as looking at books and drawing.

Communication, Language and Literacy

This half term, we will continue to 'tune into sounds' focusing on v, w, y, z, qu and ch. We will learn to identify the initial sounds of words and names of objects, as well as focus on articulating sounds correctly. We will continue to practise blending a range of words using oral blending and learn to match our name to our picture.

Supporting learning at home: helping your child to recognise their name:

- Get Creative - start by writing your child's name on a piece of paper. Then, give them pom-poms, squares of coloured paper, stickers, felt shapes, cotton balls - whatever you have that they can stick onto the letters in their name. Once dry, display proudly, perhaps on their bedroom door.
- Write their name on multiple Post-it notes. Place the Post-it notes around the house (at their table, on their bedroom door, at the front door, on their toys). Support your child to go on a 'Name Hunt' to find all the pieces of paper that have their name written on them.
- Play the card game 'SNAP!' or 'Pairs' using their name and the names of family members.



We will continue to increase our repertoire of nursery rhymes by learning and joining in with the nursery rhymes - '1,2, Buckle My Shoe', 'The Wheels on the Bus' and 'Down at the Station'. We will also be learning to recognise and make rhymes during rhyme time activities. We will continue to develop our love of reading through daily story times and we will also explore a few key texts including: 'The Most Exciting Eid', 'Jack and the Beanstalk', 'Rosie's Walk' and 'The Naughty Bus'.

Supporting learning at home: Please continue to take every opportunity to share books and read with your child, as well as sing nursery rhymes together, as it makes a huge and positive difference to their learning and development. Videos illustrating a variety of nursery rhymes can be found on the Little Wandle website in the parents section.



REACH THE HEIGHTS



In **Mathematics**, we will continue to develop our mastery of numbers up to 10, using Numberblocks, as well as through a range of adult-led and child-initiated learning activities. We will explore counting to and back from 10, as well as adding 1; we will also begin to learn about doubling.

Supporting learning at home: *Please capture opportunities to count different objects, big or small, and talk about how many there are altogether. Also, when talking about a small set of objects, include the number you are talking about e.g. "Look at those 2 dogs", or, "Please can you pick up those 4 bricks?"*

As part of daily continuous & enhanced provision, children will continue to have a broad range of opportunities indoors and out, to develop their fine and gross motor skills – this makes up their **Physical Development** offer.

Supporting learning at home: *Please continue to plan time to share active and/or outdoor play with your child. This might include: messy play, jumping, walking, dancing, swimming, climbing, skipping, games such as hide and seek, throwing and catching, scooting, riding a trike/bike and other outdoor activities.*



Our key texts will provide the springboard for learning in **Understanding the World**.

We will focus initially on learning about Eid al-Fitr; following this we will learn about growing plants; and then we will begin to learn about different kinds of travel, which will support understanding about 'forces'

Supporting learning at home:

- *Explore how things work and talk about different forces your child can feel e.g. when walking on a windy day or, when having a bath, talk about objects that float/sink.*
- *Visit a garden centre and talk about the range of seeds, bulbs, plants and gardening tools they see. Perhaps your child could plant some seeds at home and talk about their observations as they grow.*

In **Expressive Arts and Design**, we will have varied opportunities to engage with the arts, enabling exploration and play with a wide range of media and materials. A variety of creative activities will link to our themes of Eid, growing plants and transport.
